

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### **How long will my wreath last ?**

Hung outdoors, your wreaths should last throughout the holiday season and into the new year. What may affect the greens is if your door faces south with long periods of direct sunlight, or hanging a wreath between a door and storm door creating a greenhouse effect. Some people like to hang our product indoors for part of the season to enjoy the balsam fir fragrance, then hang outdoors for longer enjoyment. When using indoors, misting with water may prolong the freshness. When the greens begin to look tired, mist and return to the outdoors.

In cool moist climates, the product may reclaim some of its' freshness.

### **How long will my centrepiece last ?**

Indoors, your product should last for two to three weeks depending on the humidity level of your home.

### **Is there a way I can make my centrepiece last longer ?**

In a dry air environment misting greens with water may prolong freshness. If you are going away for a few days, the candles may be removed and the base placed in the refrigerator to extend the life of your centrepiece.

### **Can I store my wreath or centrepiece before using it ?**

If you do not plan on using their wreath or centrepiece right away, leave it packaged as you received it, place in a COLD, dark spot such as under the doorstep or in the garage. If you live in a warm climate, in the fridge or even the deep freeze works best.

#### **NOTE:**

If you store it in your deepfreeze, allow it to thaw before handling. These items become very brittle at cold temperatures below 20 F .

### **What type of candles come with the centrepiece ?**

Our candles are 10" column dripless, smokeless with lead free wicks.

- Before a party, light and extinguish the candles. They'll light more quickly and easily later.
- Avoid putting candles in drafts to prevent rapid and uneven burning and excessive dripping.
- Keep wicks trimmed to one half inch. Long or crooked wicks cause uneven burning and dripping.
- Candles refrigerated before using will burn more slowly and evenly. Wrap in foil or plastic before refrigeration to prevent wicks from absorbing moisture.
- Remove wax from washable fabrics, scrape off wax and run boiling water through material.
- When blowing out candle, hold finger in front of the flame and blow at it. The air will flow around the finger and extinguish candle from both sides and stop splattering of hot wax.
- NEVER LEAVE BURNING CANDLES UNATTENDED
